



At the helm of his third carrier, Captain William A. Schoech, USN, the Ticonderoga's Commanding Officer, is a graduate of the Naval Academy, Class of 1928, a naval aviator, a holder of the Legion of Merit and a veteran of more than twenty-five years of naval service. He received his previous carrier experience during and after the war as skipper of the U.S.S. SABLE and U.S.S. SICILY (which served in the Korean area). During the early stages of WWII, he served as Chief Staff Officer to Commander Aircraft, Seventh Fleet, in the Southwest Pacific.

Commander V. G. Lambert, USN, the Executive Officer of the "Big T", commanded Composite Squadrons 52 and Torpedo Squadron 15 on the aircraft carriers HORNET, ESSEX and BUNKER HILL during the Second World War. He was awarded the Navy Cross, (the Navy's highest award), the Silver Star, the Distinguished Flying Cross with two gold stars, the Air Medal and other ribbons. Before assuming his present duties, he was Assistant Branch Head of Aviation Current Plans and Programs for the Chief of Naval Operations. He is a graduate of Southwestern Louisiana Institute Class of 1936.
