
Commander Bert D. Terry CAG


Following graduation from Louisiana State University in 1957 Bert D. Terry began his Naval career as an AOC. After earning his wings he became a T-34 instructor with Traning Squadron 1. Following service with Attack Squadrons 125 and 155 Cdr Terry was assigned as an A-4 Project Pilot, testing and developing new weapons concepts and delivery techniques for the Naval Weapons Evaluation Facility in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Cdr Terry's association with the A-7A began in 1967 when he reported aboard Attack Squadron 122. After a tour aboard the USS CON-STELLATION as weapons training officer Cdr Terry returned to VA-122 as Weapons Dept. Head and special projects officer. His career also includes serving as Operations Officer for Commander Attack Carrier Airwing 11, Executive Officer of VA-97 aboard USS ENTERPRISE, and later Commanding Officer of VA-97 in March of 1974.

Cdr Terry reported as COMCVW-15 following a tour of duty on the Staff of COMNAVAIRPAC. Cdr Terry enjoys a distinguished career as a Naval Aviator. He has flown a total of 395 combat missions and has logged over 5000 accident free single engine flight hours. Cdr Terry also has the distinction of obtaining his 1000th arrested carrier landing and his 300th night carrier landing aboard CORAL SEA.
