



### COMMANDER T. H. DAVIE, USN

Spent three years as an aviator on the Light Cruiser HONOLULU after completion of his flight training at Pensacola, Florida, in December of 1937. After a tour of shore duty at Jacksonville, he was ordered to the Navy's first landplane patrol squadron, VP-82, in the latter part 1942. He spent the war years hunting for submarines as commander of aircraft squadrons and in staff operation. After the war, he commanded a transport squadron, VR-22 for two years, and spend an equal amount of time in Navy schools, in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations and on an aviation staff. ### COMMANDER G. S. BOGART. USN

Reported aboard the POINT CRUZ, in November, 1953 to assume duties of the executive officer. He received his wings and commission at Pensacola, Fla., in 1936 and was assigned to a patrol squadron in the Atlantic Fleet until the war. During the war he served as Commanding Officer of a "Black Cat" squadron in the Solomon Islands and later as Operations Officer for Fleet Air Wings 18 in Tinian. Following the war he was then assigned as the Naval Attache at the American Embassy, in Warsaw. This was followed by duty as Assistant Naval Intelligence Officer, in Berlin, Germany, and three years on the staff of the Naval War College. He was detached from the POINT CRUZ on 30 August, 1954.
